STEERING COMMITTEE DRAFTS CONSTITUTION, SETS \$10 ANNUAL DUES FOR NEW RADIO CLUB

The first step toward establishing a new radio club in northwest Harris County has been taken with the drafting of a proposed constitution and By-Laws. The action came during a meeting of the steering committee July 27 at the QTH of Dee Logan, WlHEO.

The format of the document was based upon samples provided by the American Radio Relay League and local radio clubs.

Contents of the drafts follow standard club organization, with a president, vice president, secretary and treasurer elected by the members during the November meeting. A board of directors will consist of officers, the immediate past president, the activities chairman and two directors—at-large. The intention is for the board meetings to be open to all members and held on a regular basis.

Annual dues were established at \$10 per year by the committee. Because of the expense of postage and printing of meeting notices, it was agreed to begin soliciting memberships immediately. A membership application appears below, and we urge you to fill it out and send in your charter membership application today. Dick Combs, N5DRM, agreed to open an account and act as interim treasurer.

The name "Northwest Amateur Radio Society" or NARS is being used for now, although members may wish to change the name. The steering committee has avoided a Houston name, since many members of the planning group live in Harris County rather than Houston.
