DESECHEO ISLAND DXPEDITION WITH K5LZO FEATURED AT NARS DECEMBER 20 MEETING

Like to be rare DX? Enjoy an exotic QTH? Then journey to Desecheo Island with NARS guest speaker Chuck Coleman, K5LZO, at our December 20 meeting.

Desecheo is a 360-acre island that is between Puerto Rico and Hispaniola. Its rocky, craggy shoreline makes it an inhospitable spot for landing delicate radio gear, and the island is inhabited by lizards, land crabs, monkeys and a few aquatic birds. And little else.

But the KP5 prefix designates a DXCC country, and is therefore sought after by the world's DX operators in quest of a new one.

Chuck will tell you what it's like to be under a pileup, how to put a station on the air far removed from the convenience of HL&P, and how you satisfy your appetite when miles away from the golden arches. His experiences were all achieved during his March, 1985, trip to KP5 with several other adventurous Texans and fellow hams from KP4 land.

The successful Desecheo operation provided this country to some 17,000 radio amateurs around the world via QSOs on SSB & CW. With Chuck for this meeting will be Frank Wyatt, KC5M.

Bring a friend to enjoy Chuck's color slides and eyewitness account. The meeting starts at 8 pm with eyeball QSOs prior to the bell. The place? Cypress Creek EMS, 16650 Sugar Pine Lane, one block east of Kuykendahl and two blocks south of FM 1960.

NARS GOES INTO OSCAR ORBIT AT ITS NOVEMBER MEETING

The November NARS gathering was a far out affair, thanks to an outstanding program by guest speaker Jack Douglas, KA5DNP, of Kingwood. The meeting also featured the introduction of guests, new members, and the chance to join ARES as well as a drawing for a door prize - a 5/8 wave 2-meter mag mount antenna from Madison Electronics - won by Walter Holmes, WD5GAZ.

OSCAR, as KA5DNP reported, is a real "Fun Machine." It swings around the earth in a large orbit that reaches 25,000 miles in space and takes 12 hours to complete. The uplink for mode B is 70 cm (435 MHz) LSB, with the downlink on 2 meters (145 MHz). Jack says that what you need to work OSCAR can be a combination of homebrew antennas and commercial gear. For the downlink, you should have a 10db gain antenna, a 20db gain preamp, and a 2-meter SSB receiver. For the uplink, a 10db circularly polarized antenna is suggested, plus an amplifier of about 75 watts working with a 70 cm SSB/CW transmitter. FM is not used on OSCAR.

Jack played a tape recording of some of his more interesting contacts. DXers in the room who lament the sunspot cycle decline drooled while hearing such goodies as KL7, DL, G, C6 and Antarctica being worked via the bird on SSB with good signals.

You may want to listen for OSCAR SSB signals around 145.972 MHz. Questions? You may call Jack at 358-5172.
