WSJT-X FT8 JS8CALL

This month W5MF will be demonstrating FT8 using WSJT-X software. This new mode has become very popular with DXer's and people who want to make quick contacts. We will be looking at the configuration and operation of this mode. We will also be demonstrating additional software features like JT Alert and Grid Tracker, which are add on programs that add some cool features. For those who wish to rag chew,



JS8Call has emerged using a similar mode to allow you to rag chew with others. WSJT-X software has additional modes like JT4, JT9, JT65 and QRA64. We will not be demonstrating them, but will take a brief look at those modes as well.

Meeting Location


We will meet at Klein Fire Department Administration, 16810 Squyres Rd., Klein, TX 77379. It is located behind Klein Fire Station 4.

Club Repeater. We have heard your concerns and after several months of pondering options and planning a course of action, we have obtained the magic information to gain access to our Club's 146.66 2-meter repeater located in the Galleria area. A team comprised of Marty Fitzgerald, Keith Dutson and Walter Holmes will have access to the repeater on March 16th. They will be taking a new antenna along with several supplies so, with a lot of mechanical/technical support (and muscle) make every attempt to bring back life to the 146.66 repeater. We encourage everyone to be on frequency in the afternoon to help them assess coverage. Keep a watch on more news via the reflector as we approach March 16th.

What is FT8? FT8 is designed for situations like multi-hop Es where signals may be weak and fading, openings may be short, and you want fast completion of reliable, confirmable QSOs. This is a low cost, low power, free application that will allow you to get out there on HF and make some contacts with help of some automation using FT8. You don't need to have a tower (forget HOA hassles). Five watts and a long wire works wonders. At our March general meeting Marty Fitzgerald will be demonstrating what equipment to use and structure of FT8.

Field Day is in planning stages. We are considering a couple options this year and need your feedback. Option #1 we have reserved the Burroughs Park. This means all activities will be outdoors rain or shine. We would still have the usual amenities as last year i.e. putting up antennas, barbecue, setup stations for CW, VHF/UHF/DMR and HF voice communications. Option #2 utilize our current Club meeting location at the Klein Fire Department Administration. This will afford us the use of a kitchen for variety of food options, Air Conditioning facility for those not wanting to tolerate the outdoor humidity, a dedicated room for amateur radio operations and, is being offered to NARS as a club station. Large parking lot behind admin building for generators, antennas. We would also set up stations for CW, VHF/UHF/DMR and HF. Please let board members know your preference and if you would be willing to participate in the planning process.

Peanut:

If you are new to DSTAR, the peanut project will give you a first impression to the world of digital HAM radio. The Peanut project will provide some reflectors but not all. If you do not have a local repeater, you can run your own hotspot (DVMega, ZUMspot or MMDVM_HS) at home

New project called Peanut you can talk with HAM amateurs around the world via an Android device or network radio. Some of the ROOMS are connected to DSTAR reflectors (XRF076B, XRF076F, XRF71L, XRF070C etc..). You only need an Android device to use DSTAR.

Access

- Make sure you are DSTAR registered user to use the DSTAR rooms!! Nobody will hear you when you are not registered.
- You need a code to enter the Peanut network. This will prevent not licensed Amateurs to use the app.
